#### What has happened this term?

**World Down Syndrome Day** – On Tuesday 21st March, Birch Wood School celebrated World Down Syndrome Day – a global awareness day which has been officially observed by the United Nations since 2012.


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#### **Theatre Visit**

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#### Work Experience for 11AM

Birch Wood School are focused on implementing a sustainable and meaningful programme of work experience. We have partnered up with Peter Le Marchant Trust to trial an innovative workplace experience called Unbox Your Future. This programme provides students and school staff with accessible labour market information; giving them the opportunity to explore different sectors and learn about job roles direct from an employer in that sector.

The students followed a four week programme with the first two weeks in school working with the employer and two weeks actually working on a long boat.
