We are very pleased to be able to share with you the different activities and initiatives that have been happening this term!



What has been happening this half term?

Fire Service Visit! - At the beginning of the school term we had a visit from the local fire service. Many students enjoyed seeing a fire engine and meeting the local fire service team. Students learnt about fire safety and how to prevent a home fire. The students were able to look around the fire engine and the fire service team shared how they use the equipment to help the local community.









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Sing and Sign Assembly – The students have enjoyed taking part in Sing and Sign assemblies! The assemblies have taken place in the hall where all students and staff have been welcome to join together and socialise whilst singing, signing and dancing to their favourite songs. The students thoroughly enjoy the community atmosphere and enjoy music as a group. The students are able to join in with the music through using their own percussion instruments.



PMLD Awareness Day - On Friday 5th May it was PMLD awareness day. PMLD is an abbreviation which stands for Profound and Multiple Learning Disabilities, and PMLD awareness day was a wonderful opportunity for us to come together as a school community and celebrate our inspirational individuals who have profound and multiple learning differences. People with PMLD may have additional sensory or physical needs, complex health needs or mental health needs, what they certainly do have is a wonderful resilience, determination and fun personality! Undiagnosed Children's Day – On Friday the 28th of April we supported the Undiagnosed Children's Day. The day is aimed at raising awareness of undiagnosed genetic conditions present in children. Each year, approximately 6,000 children in the United Kingdom are born with a syndrome without a name or a genetic disorder so uncommon that it is likely to go

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misdiagnosed. To raise awareness we took part in a Pinkathon! We encouraged everyone to come to school wearing something pink and to take part in pink themed activities! Staff and students alike, also brought in a voluntary contribution for the charity SWAN UK (Syndromes Without a Name).

We also helped raise awareness by releasing our second "The Parent Voice" podcast. Hannah O'Mara, Grange Drive Assistant Head Teacher, interviewed Steph and Rob Hayden about their experiences raising a child with an undiagnosed condition. A huge thank you to Steph and Rob who provided really valuable insights to their son Max's journey which has been hugely beneficial and enlightening to staff at school and I am sure will be beneficial to parents as well. The objective of the afternoon was for students to understand and experience volunteering their time. We also had lots of fun, as can be seen below:





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
Soft Play and Multi-Sensory Room!

The long awaited opening to our new soft play and multi-sensory room has finally arrived! As you can see below, it is a fantastic new facility and the students have thoroughly enjoyed playing and learning within it. The soft play facility is fantastic for giving our young people a safe opportunity to develop their gross and fine motor skills. It can help develop coordination, communication, balance and problem solving skills. Overall though, the students are having so much fun! In the final summer term we will be fitting the space out with further sensory lighting equipment to provide another space for multi-sensory exploration and development. The new space adjacent to the Hydro pool at Grange Drive site has been designed to allow as much accessibility as possible, with the latest hoist equipment, which will allow all our students access to the new ball pit. The local authority has supported the school with this new facility as part of a re-design of our interior at Grange Drive site in July-August 2022, which was to provide further EYFS spaces for local children who required a special school place. It is reassuring to know that we have not only been able to provide more local children with a much needed special school place but have also been able to improve facilities for all students at Birch Wood due to partnership with the LA and hard-working site staff.



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
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Student Voice at Grange Drive
