In April, students from 10CM went on a residential trip to Lea Green in Derbyshire. All students had a turn on the high ropes and all were very brave and showed great supportive teamwork. The next day they went stream walking, which was challenging but they all did very well and encouraged each other.

They worked together on the team swing where they were a very determined group of young people and then went out for a walk navigating their own route.



Evenings were spent in the games room playing pool, table football and giant Connect 4. They also practiced developing their life skills by making their own beds, helping prepare meals, washing up and tidying up afterwards.

The nurture class qualified from the 10 district areas across Leicestershire, Leicester and Rutland to compete against one another in the County Finals of, Boccia. The team proudly represented our school and the Melton and Belvoir area. The day resulted in them taking home the first place trophy for KS3-5 SLD Boccia. Further to this the group have also won the Secondary school team of the Year as part of the Let's Get Moving Melton Awards.

The day also included a Paralympic Festival which students from 9ES and the Lodge attended. One side of this festival included several activities targeting young people who are vision impaired. With support from British Blind Sport (BBS) and relevant National Governing Bodies (NGB's), these expertly adapted activities provided opportunities for young people to take part in activities such as Football, Goalball and Tennis, as well as potential talent ID/pathways to local community clubs and beyond.

The other side of the Paralympic event was a non-competitive carousel of activities including Wheelchair Sports, Multi-Sports, Cricket and Kin-ball as its activities.

We are so proud of all the achievements of the students involved in these sporting events – well done all!























PMLD Awareness Day on the 3rd of May, saw students from Birch Wood Vale and Ashton House celebrating their peers by coming to school dressed in their brightest clothing and by collecting signatures for the Changing Places petition! It was so inspiring to see our young people coming together to help make a positive change for

everyone in our community!











JM Nurture had their residential experience at Beaumanor Hall. Activities included a nature bird walk where students listened to birds and matched the sounds to the bird, a scavenger wildlife hunt followed by students creating their own pictures from things that they found and then they went off to find different insects! The first day finished with a play in the park, a blindfolded walk in the woods and a hot chocolate, before getting ready for bed. Day 2 started with den-building - making group shelters by finding sticks, ropes and sheets, working together to build the den. Afterwards they had hot chocolate and lunch before a look in the gift shop. All students were real role models throughout and had a thoroughly amazing time.









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BWV Dance Club had a brilliant time performing at Curve Theatre as part of the Icons Performance (Leicester and Leicestershire Special Schools). What an incredible experience for everyone involved!







Nurture class went on a Geocaching adventure to the lovely Rutland water. The class enjoyed following clues and spotting points of interests on their maps. Afterwards we explored Normanton church, before having a hot drink in the Waterfront café.









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On Wednesday 15th May, the Initiate Theatre Company came to put on a performance of the Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde in the Grange Drive Hall. Students from 11KJ, The Nook, 10CM and Birch Wood College attended the performance and gave the actors some rave reviews. Some of them stayed behind to talk to them about the play and say what they enjoyed about it. Others have written letters and reviews that I will hopefully be sharing with the theatre company soon.

Some of their comments include:

Students in the Moving Together dance options group travelled to Leicester City centre to explore a variety of arts organisations, including Curve Theatre, The Y Theatre, Newarke Houses and Museum, LCB Depot, and Phoenix Arts Centre. In each building, students were able to learn facts about the organisation from a variety of different people working there. This helped to broaden their knowledge of the arts industry for their Arts Award work. Students also prepared their own choreography, inspired by the words they would use to describe each organisation and this was filmed in order to be showcased in the Moving Together show at Curve Theatre in July.
