PMLD Awareness Day

On Friday 3rd May it was PMLD Awareness Day. PMLD is an abbreviation which stands for Profound and Multiple Learning Disabilities. As a school community, we continually celebrate our inspirational learners who have profound and multiple learning differences, so this year we decided to use this special day to promote awareness on a much larger scale. Our theme this year was 'Shine a Light on Accessibility!', specifically focusing on Changing Places. A Changing Place is a specialist changing area, large enough for wheelchair access with a full-sized changing bed and a hoist. On PMLD Awareness Day, our young people launched a campaign, asking for Changing Place facilities to be installed in Melton town centre, so that anyone with complex physical additional needs can access their community fully. Pupils from all sites have been collecting signatures and at the time of writing this newsletter, we currently have a whopping **1,058**!



Specialist sensory lighting and sound system equipment has been installed within for our soft play. Our young people have loved exploring the new waterless rainbow and hurricane bubble tubes, vibrating plinth and multi-coloured fibre optic strands, all of which can be controlled with accessible switches. We have mood lighting for the whole of soft play, which changes the colour of the ball pit. We have seen increased visual attention, curiosity, persistence and cause and effect being developed. The soft play facility is an incredibly engaging, stimulating and fun environment.

National Autistic Society

At Birch Wood School we are really passionate about sharing best practice. This half term we were joined by school leaders from the Renad School in Qatar, who wanted to learn about how we support our young people with Autism as part of their journey towards getting their National Autistic Society (NAS) accreditation. Renad School will be first of its kind in Qatar and are working closely with us and the NAS to do their very best for pupils in Doha at Renad. It's fantastic to know we are helping to make a positive difference internationally in partnership with the NAS. Birch Wood School received their advanced accreditation from the NAS in 2022 and we are currently applying for our Beacon status.



PE at Grange Drive

Grange Drive has demonstrated its athletic ability this half term. The Goldfinches competed at the 2024 Parallel Athletics Championship at Saffron Lane where students participated in 60m sprint races, howler throws, standing long jumps and some students even ran the 300m race. Some of the Lodge students attended the 2024 Para-Fest as Loughborough University where students competed at kin-ball, table-cricket & wheelchair-basketball. The Lodge have also begun weekly tennis sessions at Melton Tennis Club.

This half term saw a long-awaited visit from Ofsted. The brilliance of our young people and staff shone through and the inspectors couldn't help but see that! All parents/carers have now been sent the final report and I'm sure you will agree it is a very positive reflection of everyone's hard work. 
